Dear stakeholder of the Ogoni Cleanup Project, with profound love, I wish you a happy, productive, and prosperous new year, 2026. We are grateful to God for His mercies and enablement all through last year. The Project Coordination Office (PCO) of the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project (HYPREP) is particularly thankful to God for keeping us safe on project sites and in the office. As of the end of the third quarter of last year, we recorded over five million man-hours without fatality on the project, and the injury-free time is still counting. It was a major milestone in safety and project delivery on a massive project involving over seven thousand community workers doing different risk-prone tasks. These include soil remediation, shoreline cleanup, mangrove planting, and civil construction works carried out with earthmoving machinery and cranes. Indeed, our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

We are also grateful to the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, His Excellency Bola Ahmed Tinubu (GCFR), for his immense commitment to the Ogoni clean-up. Under the Renewed Hope Agenda, the Ogoni cleanup is a national priority,

and HYPREP has been charged to accelerate the cleanup. The national policy underpins the concurrent implementation of the UNEP-recommended actions that we witnessed in the past two years plus. And the development results achieved are enormous. The PCO is thankful to the Honourable Minister of Environment and Chairman of HYPREP's Governing Council (GC), Balarabe Abbas Lawal, for his visionary leadership, passion, and sustained support for the Ogoni cleanup. We remain appreciative of members of the Governing Council of HYPREP, the Chairman and members of the Board of Trustees of the Ogoni Trust Funds (BoT), and Renaissance Africa Energy for their contributions. For the larger Ogoni community and leadership, your support and ownership of the project are commendable and appreciated. We urge all project stakeholders to sustain the support of the cleanup this year with renewed vigour.

2026 is the year of consolidation, operationalization of key facilities, and enhanced human capital development. Let me congratulate the 500 successful candidates of the second batch of HYPREP postgraduate scholarships whose names are published in this edition of the HYPREP Herald. Supporting Ogoni postgraduate students with scholarships to pay school fees, buy books, and conduct quality research is sowing seeds for sustainable development. It will contribute to long-term community and national development. We have always insisted that scholarship is for distinctive scholars. The selection process was robust, stringent, and transparent. And we leave it to those who participated in the exercise to testify to the thoroughness and objective screening that birthed the scholarship beneficiaries.

The project will ensure that the Ogoni people continue to be economically empowered and that tangible benefits inclusively reach the people. All is set to commence various livelihood training programmes for Ogoni youth and women. The upcoming 10 demand-driven skill training initiatives (e.g., cybersecurity, mechatronics, software development) and five skill training programmes for people living with special needs will benefit over 2,000 Ogoni youths and women. As we start phase 2 of shoreline cleanup and mangrove restoration, phase 3 water projects, and site characterization of high-risk, complex sites for soil and groundwater remediation, the Ogoni cleanup will create over 1,500 new direct jobs for Ogoni youths and women, reinforcing the 7,000 direct jobs already created and guaranteeing decent incomes and meaningful livelihoods. To secure the project sites and infrastructure, in line with the project commitment to a non-kinetic, community-friendly security model, we will engage 1000 civil security personnel.

Happily, we completed 100% of our pilot restoration of 560 ha of oil-degraded mangroves in December 2025. The mangroves are doing very well, and mangrove-associated biodiversity, such as fish and shellfish, is gradually returning to the creeks. As we continue to monitor the growth performance and return of ecosystem services of the restored mangroves in line with international best practice, all hands must be on deck to protect the environment against repollution. In 2025, we made significant progress towards declaring the Ogoni mangrove wetlands as a Ramsar Site by the Ramsar Convention Secretariat. We shall redouble our efforts to tick the box.

We shall distribute ambulances to support public health services,

strengthen four additional government health facilities in Ogoni, complete and operationalize the Ogoni Specialist Hospital, the Buan Cottage Hospital, and the Centre of Excellence for Environmental Restoration (CEER), and complete the construction of the Ogoni Power Project transmission line, the distribution study, and commence the power distribution network. Provision of potable water is a key priority of the project. Consequently, we shall complete and inaugurate more water headworks and supply potable water to more Ogoni communities.

We shall launch the Ogoni Socio-Economic Report, rejig and raise the bar of project supervision, monitoring and evaluation, and commence field data collection for the 3-year human health biomonitoring even as we sustain momentum to complete the remediation of the medium-risk,

complex sites. Members of the HYPREP Green Frontiers (environment clubs) will facilitate greening Ogoni through participatory citizen planting of economic trees alongside our food security and blue economy initiatives.

The Ogoni cleanup project is not only about environmental and livelihood restoration; it is also about peacebuilding, capacity-building, ensuring security, and promoting transparency and accountability. We will scale up stakeholder engagement activities to ensure project stakeholders remain fully informed of both progress and challenges. We will also reinforce linkages and partnerships and optimize the visibility of the project. The project has garnered huge data on the hydrogeology of Ogoni, water quality, soil and groundwater remediation, and mangrove restoration. These datasets

and outputs of innovative research (e.g., biofertilizer and food production enhancement) conducted by the project shall be published for global benefit. As UNEP envisaged, the project will provide regional and global leadership using the CEER as a hub for innovative research and training in environmental remediation and restoration through strong collaboration with reputable institutions. The Faculty of Vocational Skill Acquisition of the CEER will sustain developing the skills of young persons for sustainable development.

The Ogoni cleanup is a rallying point for sustainable development. We therefore urge stakeholders to continue to support HYPREP to steer the transformative journey.

Restoration in Wiiyaakara that HYPREP is building. The visitors were impressed with the pace of delivery on the Ogoni Clean-up Project.

In a similar development, the Project Coordination Office organized a Scorecard Presentation/Project Review Meeting to brief key Ogoni stakeholders on the progress of work on the Project in 2025. Again, it was an exciting moment as stakeholders applauded the Project Coordinator, Prof. Zabbey, on his impressive delivery of the Project. The Honourable Minister of Environment, Balarabe Abbas Lawal and the Project Coordinator of HYPREP, Prof. Zabbey jointly presented the scorecard of the Ogoni Clean-up Project to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), who authored the report that HYPREP is implementing. The scorecard was presented to the Executive Director of UNEP, Ms. Inger Andersen during the 7th Session of the United Nations Environment Assembly held at UNEP Headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya.

In this issue, we also bring you the report on the 18th National Council on Environment held in Katsina that HYPREP participated. The occasion afforded Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey the opportunity to explain to participants the methods and strategies that HYPREP is using to deliver on its mandate across the various thematic areas of the Project. A part of the mantra of the Project Coordinator, Prof. Zabbey is inclusiveness, that no segment of the Ogoni society is left unattended to in the implementation of the UNEP Report. To this end, the Project Coordination Office organized the 2025 International Day for Persons

with Disabilities to celebrate them. Prof. Zabbey used the event to intimate these persons with special needs of the livelihood training programmes that the Project has mapped out for them.

Prof. Zabbey was at the sendoff of two Professors at the Department of Animal and Environmental Biology, University of Port Harcourt, Francis David Sikoki and Aduabobo Ibituru Hart who contributed to his academic nurturing. Prof. Zabbey used the occasion to call for data-driven research for sustainable environmental management. In furtherance of its educational development efforts in Ogoni, HYPREP has commenced the distribution of educational kits to six hundred pupils in select primary schools in Ogoni. In the same vein, the Project Coordination Office has released the list of successful candidates for its 2025 Post Graduate Scholarship Grant. The full list is published in this edition of the HYPREP Herald.

More accolades continue to pour in for Prof. Zabbey for his astute management of the Ogoni Clean-up Project and service to humanity with the presentation of additional three awards of excellence to him. 2025 was a fulfilling year for the Project, and to celebrate the workforce behind the success, an end of year party was organized for the management and staff of the Project. Our poetry corner is maintained to draw attention to the changing climate and actions to mitigate it.

OGONI SPECIALIST HOSPITAL: WE'LL IMPLEMENT ALL RECOMMENDATIONS APPROVED BY GOVERNING COUNCIL – PROF. ZABBEY

The Project Coordinator of the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project (HYPREP), Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey, has assured members of the Technical Committee on the Sustainability and Operationalization of the Ogoni Specialist Hospital, that the Project Coordination Office is determined to implement all recommendations of the Committee as approved by the Governing Council of HYPREP.

The Project Coordinator gave the assurance during the formal presentation of the comprehensive report on the operationalization of the Ogoni Specialist Hospital by the Technical Committee at the Port Harcourt Head Office of HYPREP, stating that the submission of the committee's report has brought the Project team closer to realizing a significant milestone of HYPREP's public health interventions in Ogoniland.

He expressed sincere appreciation to the Technical Planning Committee for the painstaking, detailed, and highly professional work done on the report, commending the Committee on going beyond what was expected, and that HYPREP looks forward to a robust partnership and continued collaboration with members of the Committee.

“Let me assure you that the Project Coordination Office will promptly forward this report to the Governing Council for consideration. Once the Council approves the recommendations, the Project Coordination Office will take

appropriate steps, in collaboration with relevant partners, including members of the Technical Planning Committee, to implement the recommendations in the overall public interest,” he said.

Prof. Zabbey hinted that his responsibility is to escalate the report, and called on all Ogoni communities to continue supporting the Federal Government in its effort to develop Ogoni through HYPREP by protecting critical infrastructure, including the Specialist Hospital, being provided for their benefit, stressing that these investments are meant for the people, and their sustainability depends on community ownership, vigilance, and protection.

He disclosed that the construction of the Ogoni Specialist Hospital has advanced to 78.2% completion, and that it was necessary to establish the

committee to provide a clear and sustainable pathway for its operations, adding that the committee's work is an essential phase in bringing the Hospital into use.

“The detailed planning, consultations, and assessments you have undertaken will guide the next steps as we work to complete construction and, thereafter, commence operations. The Ogoni Specialist Hospital is a central component of the multilayered public health interventions being implemented by HYPREP in Ogoniland.

“Alongside the ongoing construction of the Buan Cottage Hospital, the Human Bio-Monitoring Study, the strengthening of hospitals and health centres, regular medical outreaches, and the planned distribution of ambulances to medical

facilities, the Ogoni Specialist Hospital represents a strategic effort by HYPREP to address the longstanding health services gap, in line with UNEP's recommendations for Ogoniland.

“The importance of the Specialist Hospital to the public health needs of the Ogoni people and the wider public cannot be overstated. When completed, it would operate as a referral hub providing quality, specialized care while reducing the burden of accessing distant urban tertiary medical services,” the HYPREP Coordinator explained.

Prof. Zabbey expressed confidence that the Ogoni Specialist Hospital will significantly enhance the public health landscape in Ogoni, providing quality healthcare services to the people, and serves as a vital infrastructure that will improve health outcomes and save lives.

Chairperson of the Committee, Prof. Christie Nwidum Mato, who presented the report to Prof. Zabbey commended HYPREP on constructing such world class tertiary health facility in Ogoni, and also deeming members of the Committee fit for the task.

She lauded members of the Committee for working as real professionals, and committing their wealth of experience into the report, saying she is highly honoured and proud working with such a team of professionals.

Prof. Mato highlighted the content of the report, which has nine components. These include a Foundation for the Ogoni Specialist Hospital, Governance Structure, Operational Model, Scope of Service, Human Resources and Funding strategy.

Other components are Power

Supply, Waste Management and Environmental Protection, as well as Monitoring and Evaluation.

The Committee emphasized that the conceptualization and establishment of the Ogoni Specialist Hospital by HYPREP is a crucial step towards addressing the environmental damage and its health effects on Ogoni, adding that the initiative will fill the gap in specialist healthcare services in Ogoniland and beyond.

On May 29, 2025, a 14-Member Technical Planning Committee was inaugurated by the Project Coordinator of the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project, Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey, at the Project Coordination Office in Port Harcourt, headed by a renowned Professor of Anaesthesiology and former Acting Vice-Chancellor of PAMO University of Medical Sciences, Prof. Christie Nwidum Mato.

The Technical Planning Committee of the Ogoni Specialist Hospital (TPC-OSP), which comprised experienced healthcare professionals, academics, community and International Oil Company representatives, and relevant government officials, was expected to develop, among other strategic

objectives, a comprehensive master plan for the Ogoni Specialist Hospital, define the scope of medical services, specialized units, and technical capacities of the hospital.

Members of the TPC-OSP are Prof. Charles Tobin-West, Dr. Richard Okoye, Prof. Vincent Ndemyor, Dr. William Mube, Prof. Rosemary Ogu,

Dr. Leziga Kinanen, Prof. Kennedy Nkporbu, Mr. Legborsi Pyagbara, Dr. Tombari Gbeneol, Dr. Leziga Ndi, Dr. Lebatam Ndegwe, Dr. Kpobari Nkpa, Representative of Renaissance Africa Energy Company Limited and Representative of UNEP.

FG IMPRESSED WITH OGO NI CLEAN-UP PACE

The Federal Government of Nigeria has again assured the international community that the Ogoni Clean-up Project being implemented by the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project (HYPREP) is on course, as evident in the significant milestones recorded across thematic areas.

The Honourable Minister of Environment, Balarabe Abbas Lawal made this affirmation, when he joined the National Security Adviser, Mallam Nuhu Ribadu on a courtesy call on the Governor of Rivers State, His Excellency, Sir Siminalayi Fubara, at the Government House, Port Harcourt.

Lawal noted that the prioritisation of the Ogoni Clean-up by the President Bola Ahmed Tinubu's administration is one of the reasons for its accelerated implementation, while highlighting the notable progress made in mangrove restoration, shoreline clean-up, construction of the Centre of Excellence for Environmental Restoration (CEER), the Ogoni Specialist Hospital, provision of potable water, livelihood trainings, among others.

The Honourable Minister commended the Governor on his support for the Project and appealed to the Rivers State Government to assist

in the distribution of power to Ogoni communities when the Ogoni Power Project is completed.

He mentioned that on completion of the Buan Cottage Hospital, HYPREP will hand it over to the State Government, including five newly acquired ambulances for the General Hospitals in Eleme, Bori, Terabor, Bodo and the Primary Health Centre, Kpitem, all of which are part of its public health interventions in Ogoni.

Later, the Honourable Minister, along side the Project Coordinator of HYPREP, Professor Nenibarini Zabbey, led the National Security

Adviser, Nuhu Ribadu and his entourage to the Centre of Excellence for Environmental Restoration (CEER).

The National Security Adviser's entourage comprised the Honourable Minister of Works, Engr. Dave Umahi, Group Chief Executive of the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited, Engr. Bayo Ojulari, the SSA to the President on Community Engagement for South South, Hon. Gift Johnbull and members of the Ogoni Dialogue Committee.

OGONI CLEAN-UP: PROF. ZABBEY SEEKS STAKEHOLDERS' SUPPORT FOR SUCCESSFUL IMPLEMENTATION

As the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project (HYPREP) increases its presence in Ogoni communities through project implementation, the Project Coordinator, Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey has appealed to the leadership of various communities to support HYPREP by protecting projects sited in their respective domains.

Prof. Zabbey made the appeal in his address at HYPREP Scorecard Presentation/Project Review Meeting with key Ogoni Stakeholders held in Port Harcourt, calling on the people to put aside their differences and work for peace, progress and overall success of the Project.

He explained that the Ogoni clean-up Project, apart from environmental remediation and restoration of livelihoods, is also aimed at promoting peace and fostering development in Ogoni, and by extension, the Niger Delta.

“The Ogoni Cleanup Project is not only about environmental and livelihood restoration; it is also a peace-building, capacity-building, and development effort. We are making significant efforts to declare the Ogoni mangrove wetlands as a Ramsar Site. I therefore call on you, as key Ogoni stakeholders, to put aside your differences, come together in the common interest, and play your respective roles to ensure the success of HYPREP, which has become a rallying point for Ogoni development,” he said.

He stated that periodic review meetings remain crucial to the overall success of HYPREP, as they provide a platform for accountability,

constructive feedback, and learning, thus enabling the Project Coordination Office to identify gaps and make necessary improvements.

While encouraging participants to use the platform to bear their minds on HYPREP operations, engage positively and recommit themselves to the success of the clean-up effort, Prof. Zabbey also highlighted significant milestone achievements of the Project in the communities in the key thematic areas recommended by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), and the additional initiatives carried out by HYPREP in addressing the challenges and development needs of the people of Ogoni.

He informed the stakeholders that the Honourable Minister of Environment, Balarabe Abbas Lawal is confident that the people of Ogoni will continue to support the Federal Government's cleanup objectives in Ogoniland, noting that the Renewed Hope Agenda of the Federal

Government has made the Ogoni clean-up a national priority, effectively placing Ogoni restoration and development at the centre of national discourse and considerations alongside other efforts.

Emphasizing the need for community cooperation, the HYPREP Coordinator noted that with stakeholders' support, the Project has recorded measurable progress in the delivery of its mandate, which continues to strengthen governance in all the Local Government Areas of Ogoniland in line with the objectives of HYPREP.

Accordingly, the Project Coordinator disclosed that the phase 1 shoreline clean-up has reached 72.7% completion, phase 1 mangrove restoration at 99%, and soil and groundwater remediation of the medium-risk complex sites at 39.01% completion.

For potable water, he stated that HYPREP has provided 16 water

schemes with accompanying booster stations, supplying 42 communities across Ogoni, while construction of 29 additional facilities is underway.

In Public health interventions, Prof. Zabbey explained that the ongoing public health studies being conducted by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) of the World Health Organization are complemented by other initiatives, including the planned donation of ambulances to support and improve healthcare services in Ogoni, and the strengthening of health facilities.

According to him, HYPREP's infrastructure projects are making substantial headway, with the Ogoni Specialist Hospital at 78.2% completion, the Buan Cottage Hospital at 98.5% completion, the Centre of Excellence for

Environmental Restoration (CEER) at 93.5% completion, and the Ogoni Power Project at 61.13% completion.

Furthermore, the HYPREP Coordinator said five thousand livelihood trainings for Ogoni youths and women have been completed, with additional training activities set to commence in January 2026, including cyber security, mud lugging, commercial diving, and others, disclosing that the Governing Council has approved five specialized skills-training programmes for Ogoni persons living with disabilities to ensure their inclusion in project implementation.

“Our education support efforts continue as well, including the installation of IT and solar equipment in pilot schools, distribution of learning materials, and the planned delivery of an additional 160,000

exercise books to public primary and secondary schools, beginning in January 2026. We shall release the list of 500 beneficiaries of the batch 2 HYPREP postgraduate scholarship on January 1st, 2026. Recall that 300 Ogoni postgraduate students were awarded the scholarship in January this year.

“Local security initiatives and other critical interventions are also being implemented to enhance the quality of life of our people. We have equally scaled up stakeholder engagement activities to ensure you remain fully informed of both progress and challenges,” he pointed out.

The Project Coordinator however regretted the recent incidents at the Gwara and Ebulu Water Stations, stating that, “as we progress, we continue to face and address

challenges in our work. One of the challenges we have collectively recorded is the recent incidents at the water facilities in Gwara and Ebu communities, which we see as an important lesson for both the Project Coordination Office and the Ogoni stakeholders.

“While we await the Technical Committee's comprehensive report next week, the Technical Committee appointed to investigate both incidents, the Project Coordination Office has restored water supply in Ebu, and concerted efforts are being made to restore water to the people of Gwara to ensure they continue to enjoy access to potable water. We are also addressing community land disputes, threats of re-pollution, vandalism, operational constraints, and other emerging issues with diligence and a deep sense of responsibility to ensure that the cleanup is successful.

“As a public service institution, it is our duty to protect the public interest, and we remain committed to doing so. It is necessary to note that none of these achievements can be sustained without your support.

“HYPREP is a multi-stakeholder project with distinct roles for each partner. While the government has its responsibilities, the Ogoni community must continue to create an enabling environment for projects and activities to thrive.

“This is essential to ensure that our people, especially women and youths, continue to be economically empowered and that tangible benefits reach the people. Phase 2 of shoreline cleanup and mangrove restoration, phase 3 water projects, and site characterization of high-risk, complex sites will commence in January 2026.

ENVIRONMENT MINISTER, HYPREP COORDINATOR JOINTLY PRESENT OGOINI CLEANUP SCORECARD TO UNEP

The Honourable Minister of Environment, Balarabe Abbas Lawal has informed the Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), Ms Inger Andersen of an accelerated implementation of the UNEP report on Ogoniland under the Renewed Hope Agenda of the President Bola Ahmed Tinubu administration.

Lawal disclosed this during the 7th session of the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA) held at the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya from 8th – 12th December, 2025.

The United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA) is the highest body for environmental decision-making in

the world and the 2025 assembly focused on advancing sustainable solutions for a resilient planet.

The Honourable Minister who led the Nigerian delegation which include the Project Coordinator of the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project, Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey to the 7th Session of UNEA, used the occasion to present the Ogoni clean-up scorecard to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP).

In a bilateral meeting between the Minister of Environment and the Executive Director of UNEP, Ms Inger Andersen, the Honourable Minister briefed the UNEP boss on the achievements of the ongoing Ogoni clean-up, highlighting the various projects and programmes of the clean-up and solicited UNEP's continuous

support for the Project that their study on the Ogoni environment birthed.

At the meeting, the Project Coordinator of HYPREP, Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey informed Ms Anderson on specific thematic achievements recorded by HYPREP as well as the status of ongoing Project activities.

Three project reports were presented to the Head of UNEP, and they are the HYPREP Progress Report, the Mangrove Restoration Manual, and the Mangrove Conservation and Restoration Framework Report.

In her response, Ms Andersen remarked that the Ogoni clean-up Project is a vital hydrocarbon remediation initiative, noting that UNEP shall contribute to the

framework for the sustainable operationalization of HYPREP's Centre of Excellence for Environmental Restoration. Recall that UNEP had provided technical support to HYPREP from the inception of the project till June 2024.

Prof. Zabbey seized the opportunity of the UNEA mission to discuss partnership and collaboration between HYPREP and the Kenya Marine and Fisheries Research Institute (KMFI), following a courtesy visit to the Executive Director of KMFI at the Institute's Headquarters in Mombasa, Kenya.

The Honourable Minister of Environment, Balarabe Abbas Lawal witnessed the exploratory partnership talks between the HYPREP Project Coordinator and the KMFI Director and assured both parties of his ministerial policy support for the

initiative.

HYPREP and KMFI agreed to explore technical cooperation in mangrove restoration, oyster farming, and capacity building to achieve food security and improved income for local communities.

Also, in Mombasa, Prof. Zabbey reconnected with Dr. David Mirera, seventeen years after they both co-signed the Lampung Declaration on behalf of the African Mangrove Network (AMN) in 2007 in Indonesia. Mirera is an expert in mariculture, seaweeds and mangrove conservation at the KMFI.

In Nairobi, the Honourable Minister of Environment and the Project Coordinator of HYPREP visited the newly completed Headquarters of the St. Patrick's Missionary Society (St. Patrick Fathers) of the Catholic Church.

The interactive session with the St. Patrick Fathers was quite insightful and rewarding, with Father Kevin O'Hara in attendance. Fr. O'Hara is a veteran advocate of environmental justice and sustainability of the Niger Delta and has worked extensively in Nigeria. He founded the Port Harcourt-based frontline community development and corporate responsibility nongovernmental organisation - the Centre for Social and Corporate Responsibility (CSCR).

The St. Patrick Fathers were briefed on the progress of the Ogoni cleanup. Fr. Richard Filima, Superior General (global leader) of the St. Patrick's Missionary Society, thanked the Honourable Minister for the visit and assured him of their prayers. Fr. Filima is an Ogoni from Bodo City.

The Project Coordinator of the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project (HYPREP), Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey has sounded it clear that HYPREP through its various projects and programmes is strengthening social cohesion, promoting human dignity and building peace across Ogoni.

Prof. Zabbey who stated this at an event to commemorate the 2025

International Day of Persons with Disabilities held at Wiiyaakara in Khana Local Government Area, informed his audience that HYPREP is resolute in ensuring that the impact of the Ogoni clean-up project is felt in every household in Ogoni, including physically challenged persons.

He explained that the theme: 'Fostering Disability-inclusive Societies for Advancing Social

Progress', aligns well with HYPREP's mandate of ensuring that Ogoni people living with special needs are fully integrated into project planning and implementation for their benefits.

The HYPREP Coordinator added that the Project, over the past two years has demonstrated commitment to fostering participation and strengthening their roles as one of its critical stakeholders, which informed

the upcoming training for members of the group in five specific targeted training programmes selected by them, following the approval by the Governing Council of HYPREP.

"The programme will train persons with disabilities in areas including shoemaking, fashion and design, basic computing, fish farming, and photography. These initiatives, which are being rolled out, aim to equip you with relevant skills that will enable you live more meaningfully.

We are confident that these skills will empower you to contribute to your personal growth and development of your communities, Therefore, I urge you to make good of these opportunities."

While acknowledging the group's consistent support for the Project and the resilience it demonstrates in the

face of challenges, Prof. Zabbey encouraged the group to remain hopeful, confident, and united.

"Your abilities matter, your voices count, and your future is essential to HYPREP. We expect you to speak more for HYPREP on your platforms and with your intellect."

Head, Sustainable Livelihoods, Mrs. Josephine Nzidee stated that participants will also benefit from mobility and accessibility support, such as prosthetic limbs, wheelchairs, guide canes, clutches, and medicated lenses.

"This is a targeted approach that ensures persons with disabilities can meaningfully engage in local economic activities. We are providing the tools, skills, and practical support needed to integrate them into value chains generated by ongoing

remediation, infrastructure development, and social investment projects," Mrs. Nzidee explained.

She further stated that the training programme is focused on market-relevant skills and internationally recognised certification expected to create pathways to employment, self-employment, and entrepreneurship development for persons with disabilities.

"After the training, participants will be fully equipped with modern competencies that meet international standards. This is about building a workforce that can contribute to both the local and global economy."

President General of Ogoni Association of Persons Living with Disabilities, Dr. Ngo Baridapdoo expressed appreciation to His Excellency, President Bola Ahmed Tinubu for the confidence reposed in Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey and the Hon. Minister of Environment, Balarabe Abbas Lawal for their effective leadership and unwavering support for the Project.

The group described Prof. Zabbey as a 'Messiah of Inclusion', for demonstrating through deliberate actions that persons living with disabilities are not object of charity but equal stakeholders, deserving of dignity, opportunity, and priority.

"We are no longer objects of charity. For the first time, our voices and abilities are prioritized. We call on HYPREP and partners to establish a disability empowerment fund, provide mobility solutions, and create scholarship opportunities to sustain our participation in Ogoni's economy."

Upon assumption of office, Professor Zabbey had appointed a Desk Officer for Women and Youth, Barr. Stephanie Fiiwe to ensure the actualisation of the Project's policy of inclusivity, especially targeting the underserved communities, including women and persons with disabilities as well as stakeholders across divides.

PROF. ZABBEY ADVOCATES DATA-DRIVEN RESEARCH FOR SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

The Project Coordinator of the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project (HYPREP), Professor Nenibarini Zabbey is advocating collaborative data-driven research to formulate policies for sustainable environmental management in the Niger Delta.

Prof. Zabbey made the call at the send-off ceremony in honour of Professors Francis David Sikoki and Aduabobo Ibituru Hart of the Department of Animal and

Environmental Biology, Faculty of Science, University of Port Harcourt.

While addressing issues related to climate change, Prof. Zabbey noted that human impact on ecosystems is enormous and urged ecological studies that enable in-depth discoveries and recommendations for adaptation, mitigation, and community resilience.

He reiterated that focusing on research in ecosystem recovery will contribute to environmental

sustainability and invited interested students and researchers to take advantage of the Ogoni Cleanup Project's thematic areas for their studies.

As part of its contribution to research, HYPREP, through its internship and sabbatical programmes, provides students and lecturers with hands-on and field experience.

The HYPREP Coordinator maintained that the Ogoni Clean-up is

community-centred, with communities leading the efforts, which he said is evident in the Mangrove Restoration Programme - the world's most extensive restoration of oil-degraded mangrove, started in Ogoniland with the training of ninety (90) community women and youths in mangrove nursery management.

The ninety have trained another three hundred and five (305) persons,

who, in turn, have set up mangrove nurseries and produced six million, five hundred thousand million mangrove seedlings.

The HYPREP boss disclosed that Ogoni youth and women trained by HYPREP possess the capacity to produce the mangrove seedlings needed to restore degraded mangroves throughout the entire Niger Delta.

Prof. Zabbey highlighted other

milestone achievements of the Project and acknowledged the key contributions of the celebrants, especially in nurturing him as a young researcher at the University of Port Harcourt.

He pointed out that the tutelage and mentorship from the erudite professors have created the foundation on which he manages the Ogoni Cleanup Project.

HYPREP DISTRIBUTES SCHOOL KITS TO PUPILS IN OGONI

As part of efforts to support parents in the sponsorship of their children and wards in primary schools, the Hydrocarbon Pollution Remediation Project (HYPREP) has distributed study materials to pupils in primary schools across Ogoniland.

The exercise was earlier flagged off by the Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Environment, Mahmud Kambari during the Bane water project inauguration with the symbolic presentation of educational support items to two primary school

pupils.

The full-scale presentation of the school kits was performed by the Project Coordinator, Prof. Nenibarini Zabbey, who was represented by the Head, Livelihood Unit, Mrs. Josephine Nzidee.

Prof. Zabbey said the essence of the programme was to assist parents bear the costs of training their children and wards, and to encourage the pupils study with the donated tools and materials.

He further said the exercise was in line with ongoing efforts to promote

education and environmental awareness in all the Local Government Areas across Ogoniland.

The distribution exercise, which started with Community Primary School 1, Bane, for Day 1, and proceeded to Community Primary School 2, Bane, in Khana Local Government Area, also included sensitization of the pupils on HYPREP activities.

The items donated to each pupil include, school bag, a pack of pencils, a pack of pen, a pair of sandals, a pair of canvases, Mathematics set, a pack

of crayons, a pair of stockings, and water bottle.

In an expression of joy for the items, the beneficiaries in the various schools, represented by Master Augustine Daniel in Basic 5, CPS 2, Bane, commended HYPREP for providing them with the items, assuring that they will be more committed to their studies going forward.

On their part, parents of the pupils thanked HYPREP for cushioning the financial weight of training their children, praying for the success of the clean-up Project in Ogoni.

While some Community leaders present lauded HYPREP for its support programmes, Mr. Wakonwi Anthony Gentle of CPS 2, Bane, on behalf of the teachers in the various schools, said they were most elated

that HYPREP has wiped the tears of the pupils and their parents, adding that the kits will aid them in their teaching.

In total, six hundred pupils are to benefit from the school kits support programme, with thirty pupils from each of the twenty select schools. The schools so far visited are Community Primary School, Nyokuru; Model Primary School, Luumene, Bangha; Model Primary School, Buan; Community Primary School, 1 & 2 Bane, and Community Primary School 1, Gwara in Khana Local Government Area. Others are State Primary School 1, Akpajo and State Primary School 1, Alesa in Eleme Local Government Area. The benefiting pupils were selected through a transparent lucky dip balloting system.

Upon resumption after the Christmas and new year holidays, the HYPREP team will distribute the school kits in Bodo City Primary School 3, Bodo; Community Primary School 1, K. Dere; Tower Primary School 1, Nwe-ol; Community Primary School 1, Bera; Community Primary School 1, Bomu in Gokana Local Government Area.

For Tai, it will be State Primary School 1, Borobara; State Primary 1, Ban-Ogoi; State Primary School 1, Sime; State Primary School 1, Barayira; State Primary School 1, Korokoro; as well as State Primary School 1, Agbonchia; State Primary School 1, Alode; and State Primary School 1, Eteo in Eleme Local Government Area.
